Following the death of King Edward in 1910, Holford was equerry-in-waiting to Queen Alexandra and extra-equerry to King George. After his father, Robert Stayner Holford, died in 1892, he continued his work in developing the Westonbirt Arboretum
	Ancaster	Ancaster	Gilbert Heathcote-Drummond-Willoughby, 2nd Earl of Ancaster GCVO JP DL (1867-1951), known as Lord Willoughby de Eresby from 1892 to 1910, was a British Conservative politician. He was Joint Lord Great Chamberlain between 1910 and 1951.
	Eloise Ancaster	Ancaster	Eloise Lawrence née Breese (1882-1953) - American heiress; daughter of William Lawrence Breese of New York - wife of Gilbert above.

	Douglas Compton	Compton	Possibly Lord Douglas James Cecil Compton CBE (1865-1944) - entered the 9th Lancers as a lieutenant on 2 Sep 1885 and was promoted to captain on 5 Sep 1894. At the Coronation of King George V on 22 June 1911 the Lancer detachment was commanded by Lord Douglas, consisting of the 5th, 9th and 16th Lancers, 24 officers and 400 men

Marguerite Radclyffe-Hall		Radclyffe-Hall	Marguerite Antonia Radclyffe Hall (1880-1943) - an English poet and author. She was a lesbian, but described herself as a "congenital invert", a term taken from the writings of Havelock Ellis and other turn-of-the-century sexologists. Having reached adulthood without a vocation, she spent much of her twenties pursuing women she eventually lost to marriage.
Monday, 12 August 1912	Nastia Cheetham	Cheetham	Probably Anastasia Muravieva (aka Mouravieff) CBE (died 1976), stepdaughter of Nikolay Muraviev, the Russian Empire's Minister of Justice and later ambassador to Italy. First wife of Sir Milne Cheetham (qv)

	Herbert Asquith	Asquith	Possibly Herbert Dixon Asquith (1881-1947) - an English poet, novelist, and lawyer. Nicknamed "Beb" by his family, he was the second son of H. H. Asquith, British Prime Minister and the younger brother of Raymond Asquith
	Granby	Granby	Henry Manners, Marquess of Granby, later 8th Duke of Rutland
	Stephen Burton	Burton	Major Stephen John Burton (1882-1917) - twin son of Alfred Henry Burton and Ellen Amelia Burton of St Leonard's Lodge, St Leonard's on Sea. His twin brother, Captain Robert Cecil Burton died as a result of wounds on 16th March 1915. Stephen, a major in the Coldstream Guards, died at Boesinghe, overlooking the Yser Canal, in the Ypres Salient on 20 July 1917
	Ian Hamilton	Hamilton	Possibly General Sir Ian Standish Monteith Hamilton, GCB, GCMG, DSO, TD (1853-1947) - senior British Army officer who had an extensive British Imperial military career in the Victorian and Edwardian eras. He served as General Officer Commanding Southern Command between 1905 and 1909 and was serving as Adjutant-General to the Forces between 1909 and 1910

	Jean Hamilton	Hamilton	Possibly Jean Hamilton née Muir, the daughter of a Glasgow businessman - wife of Ian Hamilton
	Cynthia Asquith	Asquith	Lady Cynthia Mary Evelyn Asquith née Charteris (1887-1960) - an English writer and socialite, known for her ghost stories and diaries. She also wrote novels, edited a number of anthologies and wrote for children
