13v	Sunday, 15 June 1913	Edmond L Warre	Warre	Possibly Edmond Warre CB CVO (1837-1920) - Headmaster and Provost of Eton College (1884-1905)
		Douglas Compton	Compton	Possibly Lord Douglas James Cecil <b>Compton</b> CBE (1865-1944) - entered the 9th Lancers as a lieutenant on 2 Sep 1885 and was promoted to captain on 5 Sep 1894. At the Coronation of King George V on 22 June 1911 the Lancer detachment was commanded by Lord Douglas, consisting of the 5th, 9th and 16th Lancers, 24 officers and 400 men
		Madeline Whitbread	Whitbread	Possibly wife of Samuel Herbert Whitbread (qv)
		Gerald Wellesley	Wellesley	Possibly Gerald Wellesley, 7th Duke of Wellington, KG, DL, FRIBA (1885-1972), styled Lord Gerald Wellesley between 1900 and 1943 - an Anglo-Irish diplomat, soldier, and architect. He held the office of Third Secretary of the Diplomatic Service 1910-17, and the office of Second Secretary of the Diplomatic Service 1917-19.
		Pauline Stephen-Cotton	Stephen-Cotton	Pauline Edith Stapleton-Cotton (1877-1964) - the daughter of Colonel Hon. Richard Southwell George Stapleton-Cotton and Hon. Jane Charlotte née Methuen. She achieved the rank of Deputy Administrator in the Women's Royal Air Force.
		B Grenfell	Grenfell	Possibly William Henry Grenfell, 1st Baron Desborough, KG, GCVO, DL (1855-1945) - a British athlete, sportsman, public servant and politician. He sat in the House of Commons first for the Liberal Party and then for the Conservatives between 1880 and 1905 when he was raised to the peerage
	Saturday, 28 June 1913	Richard F Cavendish	Cavendish	Possibly Lord Richard Frederick Cavendish, CB, CMG, DL, JP (1871-1946), known as Richard Cavendish until 1908, was a British aristocrat, author, magistrate, and politician.

		Ruby Peto	Peto	Frances Ruby Vera Peto née Lindsay - wife of Ralph (qv)
		Henry Bentinck	Bentinck	Lord Henry Cavendish-Bentinck (1863-1931), known as Henry Cavendish-Bentinck until 1880, was a British Conservative politician.
		Christine Hamlyn	Hamlyn	Christine Louisa Hamlyn Fane (1855-1936) – daughter of Col. Henry Edward Hamlyn Hamlyn Fane and Susan Hester Hamlyn Fane née Hamlyn-Williams. In 1889 Christine married Henry Gosling and persuaded him to change his name to Hamlyn because of the long association of the Hamlyn family with the Clovelly estate which she inherited in 1884.
		Raymond Greene	Greene	Sir Walter Raymond Greene, 2nd Baronet, DSO (1869-1947) - a British Conservative politician. He was the second son of Edward Greene (later Sir Edward Greene, 1st Baronet) of Nether Hall, Suffolk. Greene served on the western front throughout WW1. He initially served with the 9th Queen's Royal Lancers, winning the Distinguished Service Order (DSO). He later commanded the 2/3rd County of London Yeomanry (Sharpshooters), before ending the war as a staff officer. Following the war, he successfully defended his parliamentary seat in 1918. On the death of his father in 1920, he succeeded to the baronetcy
