| | | Duff Cooper | Cooper | Alfred Duff Cooper, 1st Viscount Norwich, GCMG, DSO, PC (1890-1954), known as Duff Cooper - a British Conservative Party politician and diplomat who was also a military and political historian. Almost all his closest friends, including Shaw-Stewart, Horner and Asquith were killed in WW1, allowing him to draw closer to Lady Diana Manners, a socialite who was known for her eccentricities, and was born in 1890 |
| | | Granby | Granby | Henry Manners, Marquess of Granby, later 8th Duke of Rutland |
| | | Ralph Peto | Peto | Major Sir Ralph Harding Peto (1877-1945) - author and army officer |
| | | Nancy Cunard | Cunard | Nancy Clara Cunard (1896- 1965) - a British writer, heiress and political activist. She was born into the British upper class and devoted much of her life to fighting racism and fascism. She became a muse to some of the 20th century's most distinguished writers and artists, including Wyndham Lewis, Aldous Huxley, Tristan Tzara, Ezra Pound and Louis Aragon—who were among her lovers—as well as Ernest Hemingway, James Joyce, Constantin Brâncuși, Langston Hughes, Man Ray and William Carlos Williams. Cunard's father was Sir Bache Cunard, an heir to the Cunard Line shipping businesses and a baronet. Her mother was Maud Alice Burke, an American heiress. When her parents separated in 1911, she moved to London with her mother |
| | | Diana Manners | Manners | Diana, Viscountess Norwich, née Lady Diana Olivia Winifred Maud Manners (1892-1986) - an English actress and aristocrat who was a well-known social figure in London and Paris. As a young woman, she associated with the celebrated group of intellectuals known as the Coterie. Wife of Duff Cooper (qv) |
