		Douglas Compton	Compton	Possibly Lord Douglas James Cecil Compton CBE (1865-1944) - entered the 9th Lancers as a lieutenant on 2 Sep 1885 and was promoted to captain on 5 Sep 1894. At the Coronation of King George V on 22 June 1911 the Lancer detachment was commanded by Lord Douglas, consisting of the 5th, 9th and 16th Lancers, 24 officers and 400 men
		Ulrica Baring	Baring	Lady Ulrica Baring née Duncombe, daughter of William Duncombe, 1st Earl Feversham
		Marjorie Manners	Manners	Victoria Marjorie Harriet Paget, Marchioness of Anglesey, née Manners (1883-1946) - British writer on art and an illustrator - Daughter of Henry Manners, 8th Duke of Rutland
		George Holford	Holford	Lieutenant-Colonel Sir George Lindsay Holford KCVO CIE CBE (1860-1926) - a British Army officer and courtier. Following the death of King Edward in 1910, Holford was equerry-in-waiting to Queen Alexandra and extra-equerry to King George. After his father, Robert Stayner Holford, died in 1892, he continued his work in developing the Westonbirt Arboretum

		Plymouth	Plymouth	Possibly Robert George Windsor-Clive, 1st Earl of Plymouth, GBE, CB, PC (1857-1923) - a British nobleman and Conservative politician
		H Maitland Kersey	Kersey	Possibly Major Henry Maitland Kersey DSO (1861-1941) - First on staff of General Saint George Henry, afterwards with the 15th Battalion Imperial Yeomanry. Captain Hertfordshire Yeomanry and Honourable Major in the Army.
		Basil Blackwood	Blackwood	Possibly Lord Ian Basil Gawaine Hamilton-Temple-Blackwood (1870-1917), known as Lord Basil Temple Blackwood, was a British lawyer, civil servant and book illustrator. On the outbreak of WW1, Blackwood obtained a commission as a 2nd Lieutenant in the 9th Lancers, at the age of 44. He was killed in action in a night raid at Boesinghe near Ypres on 4 July 1917. His name is inscribed on the Menin Gate Memorial to the Missing
