		Ian Malcolm	Malcolm	Possibly Sir Ian Zachary Malcolm, 17th Laird of Poltalloch, KCMG (1868-1944) - Conservative Member of Parliament elected as MP for Stowmarket from 1895 to 1906, Croydon from 1910 to 1918 and Croydon South from 1918 to 1919. He also held many diplomatic and political appointments
		Diana Manners	Manners	Diana, Viscountess Norwich, née Lady Diana Olivia Winifred Maud Manners (1892-1986) - an English actress and aristocrat who was a well-known social figure in London and Paris. As a young woman, she associated with the celebrated group of intellectuals known as the Coterie

		Gerald Grenfell	Grenfell	Possibly Gerald William ("Billy") Grenfell (1890 – 1915) – British soldier poet - He was killed at Hooge, West Flanders, Belgium on 30 July 1915. His body was buried where he fell and he has no known grave, but he is remembered on the Menin Gate Memorial, Ypres
		Jeanne Malcolm	Malcolm	Presumably Jeanne Malcolm née Langtry, daughter of Lillie Langtry, the famous actress - wife of Ian

		Louis Mallet	Mallet	Possibly Sir Louis du Pan Mallet GCMG CB PC (1864-1936) - British diplomat who was Ambassador to the Ottoman Empire at the outbreak of WW1
		Nastia Cheetham	Cheetham	Probably Anastasia Muravieva (aka Mouravieff) CBE (died 1976), stepdaughter of Nikolay Muraviev, the Russian Empire's Minister of Justice and later ambassador to Italy. First wife of Sir Milne Cheetham

		Lytton	Lytton	Victor Alexander George Robert Bulwer-Lytton, 2nd Earl of Lytton, KG, GCSI, GCIE, GCStJ, PC, DL (1876-1947) - a British politician and colonial administrator.
		Alexander Thynne	Thynne	Lord Alexander George Boteville Thynne DSO (1873-1918) - a British Army officer and Conservative politician. Killed in action in France in September 1918
		Alexander Hoyos	Hoyos	Possibly Ludwig Alexander Georg Graf von Hoyos, Freiherr zu Stichsenstein (1876-1937) - an Austro-Hungarian diplomat who played a major role during the July Crisis (following the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand in Sarajevo on 28 June 1914) while serving as chef de cabinet of the Foreign Minister at the outbreak of WW1 in 1914
		Hugh Cecil	Cecil	Hugh Richard Heathcote Gascoyne-Cecil, 1st Baron Quickswood PC (1869-1956), styled Lord Hugh Cecil until 1941, was a British Conservative Party politician. In 1910 Cecil became an MP for Oxford University, which he represented for the next 27 years
	Friday, 23 June 1911	Patrick Shaw-Stewart	Shaw-Stewart	Patrick Houston Shaw-Stewart (1888-1917) - a British scholar and poet of the Edwardian era who died on active service as a battalion commander in the Royal Naval Division during WW1. He is best remembered today for his "Achilles in the Trench", one of the best-known war poems of the First World War. He was a leading member of Lady Diana Manners (qv) "corrupt coterie" known as the Coterie
		Marjorie Manners	Manners	Victoria Marjorie Harriet Paget, Marchioness of Anglesey, née Manners (1883-1946) - British writer on art and an illustrator - Daughter of Henry Manners, 8th Duke of Rutland
		Constance Manners	Manners	Possibly Betty Constance Asquith née Manners (1889-1962), wife of Hon. Arthur Melland Asquith

Mervyn Herbert	Herbert	The Honourable Mervyn Robert Howard Molyneux Herbert (1882-1929) of Tetton, Kingston St Mary in Somerset, was a career diplomat and a first-class cricket player. As a cricketer, Herbert was a right-handed middle-order batsman. He played for Eton in the 1901 Eton v Harrow cricket match at Lord's. In the same year, he made the first of six appearances in first-class cricket for Nottinghamshire, but from 1903 most of his first-class cricket was for Somerset. Herbert's diplomatic career started when he was appointed as an attaché in the Foreign Office in 1907. He became a third secretary in the Diplomatic Service in 1910 and in 1916 he was further promoted to become a second secretary. Then in 1919 he became a first secretary serving in embassies and delegations in Rome, Lisbon, Madrid and Cairo, and was first secretary in Madrid up to 1922, returning to a Whitehall job in the Foreign Office between 1924 and 1926
